## President's report

*A key outcome from the planning weekend was that we needed to put greater energy and resources into providing an improved social program.*

Season 2015 was another massive year for the VFUA in what was my first year as president of a body that represents a terrific group of people. Having served three years on the Executive, I decided I would accept the presidency following Steve Piperno's promotion to the AFL.

The role of president is certainly a challenging one. However it is fulfilling and teaches you many skills along the way.

Following a successful planning weekend, the Executive Committee worked hard to ensure that the agreed outcomes were actioned and achieved over the course of the season. I was impressed with how well the Executive worked as a team, especially given the number of new members on the committee.

One of the key outcomes from the planning weekend was that the VFUA needed to put greater energy and resources into providing an improved social program for members. Tyler Hankinson and Joe Hartwig were charged with providing a social program that would appeal to members from all disciplines. They developed three new events this year which, due to their planning and execution, were all very successful. I would like to thank both of them for their hard work, commitment and support during the course of the year. Additionally, I would like to thank my Grand Final Ball working party Tyler, Tim Carlos, Jared Dyson, Jacob Carroll, Dylan Benwell and Matt Dervan for their hard work in making that night such a success. I hope that this year's social program has provided a good base for future executives to work from so that members can socialise on a more frequent basis.

The year provided its challenges. Peter Kelly took a leave of absence and travelled overseas which meant correspondence during his time away was subject to differing time zones.

In our second year of the current employment agreement, the VFUA was able to secure some further benefits for umpires including a four boundary umpire system in the TAC Cup grand final and a new finals payment structure for the Victorian Women's Football League.

The year also saw a spike in industrial issues

centred around the fees and conditions package and included one formal dispute which, after lengthy meetings and discussions, was resolved to the satisfaction of members concerned and included 20 Sherrin footballs for umpires to use during the 2016 pre-season, which will be a fantastic development tool. Richard Mills and Shane Stewart were of great service to the Executive during the dispute and deserve many thanks.

The association also launched a new look website at the start of 2015. The new look and layout of the website gave the VFUA a professional new face with added features. Special thanks to Luke White and David Flegg for putting it together and keeping material up to date during the course of the year.

Throughout the year we struggled to find a suitable venue for our association meetings. We required a suitable meal at reasonable costs for 80 people in close proximity to Victoria Park. Our first two meetings were held at Mesa Greek Restaurant whilst the third was held at the refurbished Skinny Elephant in Clifton Hill. We were able to attract a quality key speaker for each meeting - Steve Piperno, AFLUA President Chris Kamolins and, on the eve of the VFL finals series, Steve McBurney who gave his insights into preparing for finals footy. The VFUA also published three editions of the *Man in White* newsletter. My special thanks to Luke White for coordinating their publishing and printing and to the various track scribes that supported him.

The presentation of a posthumous life membership to Anthony Hunter was an important event during 2015. Anthony was a passionate umpires' man who served in a variety of roles on the Executive Committee. The life membership award was accepted by Anthony's family who attended the Life Members' Function. I would like to thank Adam Havelberg for the job he did managing the life members' program during the year.

I would like to thank several people who have been very supportive of me in my role as president. Firstly, thanks must go to Steve Piperno who provided invaluable advice and support, initially whilst serving as his vice-president last year and again during the course of this year.

Thank you to my Executive Committee for their terrific support and enthusiasm during the year. Having a good team to work with is a pleasure and I would especially like to thank each of the track representatives - Michael Curtis, Luke McIlroy, Lachlan Rayner, Curtis De Witt and Callum Leonard - for the way they represented the members of their respective squads.

I would also like to thank David Flegg and Peter Kelly for their continued service to the VFUA which now covers a span in excess of 23 years. Their passion for the VFUA has ensured the VFUA remains a respected and progressive association, whilst ensuring the historical aspects are preserved. Special thanks to David for the terrific job he does maintaining members' statistics, keeping track of milestones and ensuring published records are accurate and timely.

To Chris Snell, who fulfilled part of Peter's role in his absence, thank you for stepping in and making your time available. Chris, a life member and former president of the VFUA, is well respected amongst his umpiring peers and I welcomed his valued input and support.

On behalf of the Executive and its members, I would like to thank Cameron Nash and Angela Lindsay for the terrific job they do for umpires in the VFL competitions. Their passion for umpiring cannot be questioned and the structure they provide ensures all umpires are given their best shot at umpiring at the elite Victorian level. The department should also be proud of how it brought the umpiring family together at a time of difficulty for training supervisor Kym Brockhoff. Kym, who has been involved with umpires for more than 20 years suffered a heart attack and later a stroke. The department organised a benefit night and other activities which raised \$13,681 mainly from umpires. The direct VFUA contribution was \$200 and its members were primary contributors to the

cause. Kym was most emotional on the night and in good news continues to recover. To the support staff who back us up each week both on and off the field - thank you also.

To my vice-president and good mate Adam Havelberg well done on a terrific season both on and off the field. Your support during the year was really appreciated and I look forward to watching and being a part of your success in future years.

Finally, my last thank you is the most important one. To you, the members, of the greatest state league association, I sincerely thank you. Your support during the year has been overwhelming and your enthusiastic support of the VFUA has made my job all the more enjoyable.

I ask each of you to continue your support of next year's Executive and to support future social programs so that we enjoy some off field moments socially. I would encourage members to be involved, be it on working parties or on the Executive Committee. It is a most rewarding experience and certainly provides opportunities for developing different types of skills. I am certainly a better person for having served for four years on the Executive. It truly is a benefit to be able to assist in making our motto "Umpires for the Future" real and alive.

I hope you all are enjoying the off-season and come back striving for success in 2016.

## Executive officer's report

*The dispute illustrated how vital it is for AFL Victoria and other parties to actively involve the VFUA in changes and programs that impact upon umpiring*



On behalf of the VFUA Executive Committee, I am pleased to submit the annual report and financial statement for the 2014-15 financial year to our members and life members.

This year was quite different in that I had the opportunity to travel overseas for nearly six months and the executive team, despite the possible inconvenience to them, were keen for me to pursue this. It was sometimes tricky communicating, especially with different time zones, but with forward planning and technology we made it work.

Our new executive team was bolstered this year with the addition of extra resources devoted to developing and administering a comprehensive social program for our members. A full report of the social season begins on page 10.

We welcomed new comers Lachlan Rayner who replaced Lawrence Coop as senior boundary track representative in an early season election and Curtis De Witt who replaced Anthony Laughton as development boundary track representative following his work appointment to Brisbane.

Michael Curtis and Luke McIlory returned to their respective roles as track representatives for the Senior and Development Field Umpires' Squads, despite Luke's promotion to the VFL Senior Field Squad. Callum Leonard also returned as the track representative for the Senior and Development Goal Umpires' Squads.

Daniel Butcher stepped into the role of president, ably assisted by his vice-president Adam Havelberg. David Flegg continued in his role of historian-statistician for the VFUA. Luke White, who announced his retirement from umpiring in September, undertook the important role of communications officer.

### Leadership

The Executive Committee comprises an Operations Group consisting of the president, vice-president and executive officer. To strengthen the ongoing leadership and strategic positioning of the VFUA the position of historian-statistician was added to the Operations Group. The broader Executive Committee includes the Operations Group, the communications officer and track representatives. Social and special project officers also attended Executive meetings.

As part of its planning activities, the Executive Committee developed an Objectives Plan for 2015 and undertook a two day planning weekend in February 2015. This allowed the committee to induct new members, assign responsibilities and explain expectations for season 2015. The committee also met frequently during the year to monitor progress against the plan and to work on upcoming activities.

### Membership

In 2015, 131 umpires joined the VFUA out of a total of 137, which represented 95 percent membership. This percentage is consistent with recent years and represents a challenge for future executive committees in ensuring the VFUA proactively markets and promotes the services it provides to ensure umpires see the value-add of becoming a VFUA member. This is particularly difficult for the VFUA given the high turnover of umpires and the association's limited resources.

The VFUA also welcomed 43 new umpires in season 2015. An induction night was held for new umpires in April and umpires who chose to join the VFUA were presented with a free VFUA polo shirt.

### Representation

There was a significant rise in the number of issues requiring VFUA involvement during the season. Some of these were simply due to changes in the football environment which required discussion and deliberation and possible changes to the VFUA – AFL Victoria Employment Agreement 2014-2016. The VFUA was pleased to see the introduction of a fourth boundary umpire for the 2015 TAC Cup Grand Final. In accordance with the wishes of the VFL Umpiring Department, the VFUA agreed to a more formal structure being introduced for umpires who would officiate in the Victorian Women's Football League for season

2015. The VFUA also negotiated final payments for the VWFL, which commenced this year.

The VFUA also represented a number of umpires in issues they had raised with us. Issues ranged from answering industrial type questions to full representation of umpires in a more formal way. The importance of being a VFUA member was illustrated early in the year when the association had to formally turn down representing an umpire who had chosen not to become a member in 2014.

The VFUA was also involved in a formal dispute with AFL Victoria over a breach of our employment agreement. The dispute centred on how the AFL Umpiring Department and the VFL Umpiring Department were administering the AFL Umpires' Pathway program and the average number of AFL umpires appointed to VFL matches each week. The VFL senior field umpires voted to commence industrial action if changes were not made. A compromise was agreed upon and industrial action was avoided.

This dispute illustrates how important it is for AFL Victoria and other parties to actively consult with and involve the VFUA in changes and programs that impact upon umpiring. The VFUA will be meeting with AFL Victoria, the AFL Umpiring Department and the AFL Umpires' Association during the off-season to work through some outstanding issues.

The VFUA also worked closely with the AFL Umpires' Association and met with its Chief Executive Officer Peter Howe and President Chris Kamolins during the season. The VFUA also welcomed Chris as guest speaker at its second Association meeting in June. Special thanks to Peter Howe for his advice and ongoing support throughout the year.

## Relationship – AFL Victoria

The VFUA continued to work with the VFL Umpiring Department, both in day to day operations and in the application of the current employment agreement.

The association also maintained dialogue with AFL Victoria Head Office, attended VFL Umpiring Department functions and continued dialogue with other state based Associations. This included a visit from WANFLUA President Jacob Mohen. Adam Havelberg and Steve Piperno hosted him to dinner to share umpiring association information and discuss umpiring and football in general. The visit included a tour of the Buffalo Centre.

The VFUA has a healthy working relationship with the AFL Victoria Umpiring Department. David Flegg maintains statistics and milestones which are provided to the department on a weekly basis.

I would like to commend Cameron Nash for the role he has undertaken this year. Cameron is an umpires' man, and his support and passion for umpiring cannot be understated. I would like to thank him for his support this year and for dealing with some sensitive issues in a professional and timely manner. Angela, a terrific support to our umpiring team, continues to demonstrate why she has been in the role so long. Thanks Angela for your efforts in 2015. I would also like to thank all the observers, coaches, trainers, physios, dieticians and sponsors who provide such valued support behind the scenes. Our members appreciate your enthusiasm, guidance and support in helping them throughout a long and challenging season.

## Communication

The VFUA continued to focus on improved communication with members and life members. Life Members' Liaison Officer Adam Havelberg provided regular emails and updates to life members during the year.

Regular emails, SMS messages, association meetings, verbal briefings and website updates were provided to keep members informed during the course of the year.

Communications Officer Luke White oversaw three quality productions of the *Man in White* magazine while also designing and launching a new association website featuring improved branding and functionality.

## VFUA Survey 2015

The VFUA once again conducted its biennial survey of members in April. The survey has been conducted since 1999 and results are used by the executive committee to measure improvements achieved since the last survey and to identify areas requiring improvement and focus going forward.

The survey in 2015 was completed by 126 umpires, which represents approximately 91% of umpires. The survey results are therefore statistically valid, a rich source of information and reflect the views of the current membership base. The number of umpires completing the survey has increased due to increases in list sizes. Eighty-five surveys were completed in 2003, 110 in 2013.

The executive committee focused on the results from 2013 when planning for 2015 and made a decision to focus on improved communication with members, a revamped social program with more enjoyable and affordable events together with improved awareness and understanding of the quality assurance program. The executive committee also reviewed the results of the 2015

survey in May and made adjustments to the 2015 planning document where there was a requirement to do so. More information on the survey results are contained in the e-version of this report on the VFUA web site.

Pleasingly, the results reinforced a number of items of importance to the leadership group, namely that the VFUA understand and caters for today's needs (95% agree or strongly agree) and the VFUA responds to umpiring issues and members' concerns in an appropriate and timely manner (86% agree or strongly agree). In addition, 81% surveyed believed that the VFUA is progressive, constantly changing with the times to provide a highly effective service to its members, which was a 6% improvement on the results from 2013.

Feedback from the survey will be discussed with AFL Victoria and will be used to inform planning for 2016.

### Quality Assurance Program

There was an increased focus on reporting and feedback for the QAP in 2015. Security at certain grounds remained of concern, however improvements due to constant follow up and reporting seemed to have the problem under control by season's end. The program was also used for the first time at grounds in the Victorian Women's Football League. Special thanks to David Flegg for coordinating and managing a busy flow of communications and to Michael Blair for his contribution in coordinating the VFUA's QAP for season 2015.

### Annual Report

The VFUA has again had David Flegg working diligently on reviewing and enhancing the association's annual report so that it is a living memory of the 'year just gone' for our members. He has been instrumental in organising photos during the season and during the grand finals. Thank you to David for again coordinating such an enormous task and to the many scribes who contributed to the content of the report.

I would like to congratulate all umpires who achieved personal milestones this year and to our grand final umpires who represented us all so well. Congratulations to Hayden Gavine (field), Leigh Buwalda (boundary) and Callum Leonard (goal) who were voted most improved in their respective categories and to Leighton Rowe (field), David Park (boundary) and Cameron Milich and Brad Standfield (goal) on winning their squad's 2015 Best First Year Umpire Awards.

Congratulations to Leighton Rowe for being the recipient of this year's Frank Leverett Shield – the best first year umpire across all categories.

Thank you to the Executive Committee for your hard work, enthusiasm and humour during the year and for working with me via email so well. It has been a pleasure to work with such a united and hard working group and it was especially pleasing to see how many of you featured in the finals this year. Michael, I don't know how you do it, raising a young family, working for one of the big accounting firms whilst balancing umpiring etc. Lachlan, it is always pleasing to see someone who is willing to volunteer his time for the Executive. Congratulations on your Umpire of the Year award and VFL grand final appointment.

Thanks to Daniel Butcher for the terrific job he has done as president during the year. Each president brings a unique approach to the job and Daniel, after serving as vice-president in 2014, was ready for the step-up. Daniel, with his low key style, played a pivotal role in working with the VFL Senior Field Squad in resolving the AFL umpire appointment issue. He has also put his stamp on social functions continuing on from his role in 2014. He has also proven that umpires who get involved with the VFUA can also be successful on field. Well done on your VFL grand final and Umpire of the Year award.

To Adam, I am looking forward to working with you as president in 2016. It only seems weeks ago, we had that conversation at the 2014 Grand Final Ball about you joining the Executive Committee. You have certainly been a great support as vice-president and your work with the Life Members' Program has been terrific.

Fleggy, I am running out of good things to say about you. Always there, always supportive, always gets the work done. A tower of strength as part of the Operations Group, David you have once again excelled in your role. Thank you again for the terrific support you provided during the year.

To Chris, thank you for volunteering to step in for me. I know you enjoyed getting your hands dirty again with umpiring affairs and re-establishing contacts in the football world. ## 2014 Life membership - Anthony Hunter



Anthony Hunter was a VFL umpire between 2003 and 2012 and umpired 115 games, 73 as a field umpire and 42 as a boundary umpire, including 20 senior matches and 3 TAC Cup finals. He was a VFUA member throughout the duration of his time as an umpire and served on the Executive in 2012 as boundary umpire track representative and in 2013 as special projects officer. He also accepted a role as boundary umpire observer for AFL Victoria in 2013.

Anthony was an extremely valuable member of the VFUA Executive regardless of the various roles he held. He had a wonderful understanding of the association, an unrivalled passion for the welfare

of umpires with the enthusiasm, motivation and work ethic to do something about it. Anthony was heavily involved in organising events, coordinating merchandise, promoting association matters and countless other tasks. He was also a very good strategist, contributing to industrial and other significant VFUA matters in a way that was always in the best interest of umpires. He was held in such high esteem that he became a member of the Operations Group, participating in discussions and decision making usually reserved for the president, vice-president and executive officer. A role of special projects was also created for him in 2013 due to his passion and desire to stay involved as a non-running umpire.

Aside from the tireless hours of contribution to the VFUA, Anthony was a respected and loved person and umpire. He was known for his big smile, his cheeky and infectious personality, but also for his commitment and dedication to getting the best out of his own umpiring. He was so well respected amongst the group that not only peers looked up to him as a mentor, but even coaches sought his advice.

On the night of Friday 12 April 2013, Anthony was tragically killed in a motorcycle accident, sending shockwaves through the umpiring group. At the time of his passing, he was an employee of AFL Victoria, a member of the VFUA Executive and a dear and loved friend of so many, his absence still leaves a gaping hole in the umpiring community. Anthony's service and contribution to the VFUA make honorary life membership an extremely fitting and well deserved tribute.

About 20 people showed up under sunny skies to enjoy some hotly contested bowling as well as some snags and drinks.



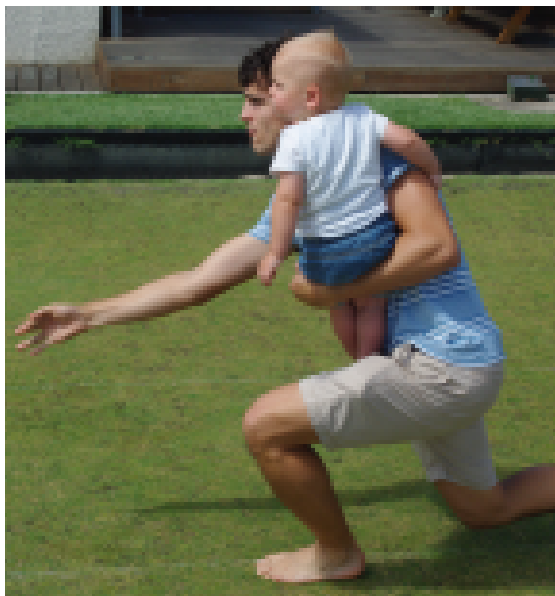

The last of the formalities involved awarding the best first year umpires from each discipline.

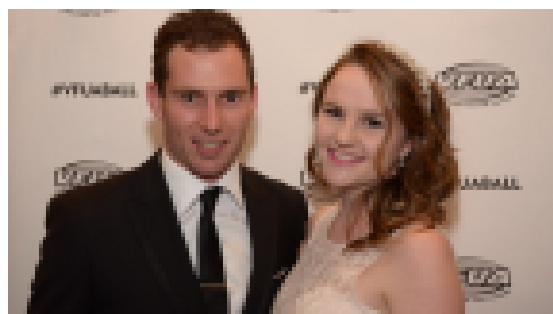

Steve Piperno was awarded the 2014 John Russo Trophy.

On the field Steve had an outstanding season. He umpired 4 VFL finals and was appointed to officiate in the 2014 VFL Grand Final. In his career Steve has officiated in 156 VFL senior games, 20 AFLV Development/VFL Reserve Games and 21 TAC Cup games as a goal umpire. He has featured heavily in the business end of the season and has umpired in 18 VFL finals including 6 grand finals – 2 VFL, 1 Reserves and 3 TAC Cup. In 2014, Steven officiated his 150th VFL match – Collingwood v. Essendon.

## 2015 VFUA survey

The VFUA once again conducted its biennial survey of members in April.

The survey has been conducted since 1999 and results are used by the Executive Committee to measure improvements achieved since the last survey and to identify areas requiring improvement and focus going forward.

The survey in 2015 was completed by 126 umpires, which represents approximately 91% of umpires. The survey results are therefore statistically valid, a rich source of information and reflect the views of the current membership base. The number of umpires completing the survey has increased due to increases in list sizes. Eighty-five surveys were completed in 2003, 110 in 2013.

The Executive Committee focused on the results from 2013 when planning for 2015 and made a decision to focus on improved communication with members, a revamped social program with more enjoyable and affordable events together with improved awareness and understanding of the Quality Assurance Program. The Executive also reviewed the results of the 2015 survey in May and made adjustments to any 2015 planning document where there was a requirement to do so.

Pleasingly, the results reinforced a number of items of importance to the leadership group, namely that the 'VFUA understand and caters for today's needs (95% agree or strongly agree) and the VFUA responds to umpiring issues and members' concerns in an appropriate and timely manner (86% agree or strongly agree). It is important to note that the VFUA sometimes responds to issues confidentially and, in some cases, without members being notified.

The survey found the following changes (>5%) since the last survey in 2013:

**Leadership** - Providing strong leadership that promotes an ethos of communication and teamwork

- The VFUA is progressive, constantly changing with the times to provide a highly effective service to its members - 2015 (81%) vs 2013 (75%). The senior squads rated 88% vs the development squads at 74%

**Operations** - Planning and managing the operations of the association to ensure the services provided meet the differing needs of our members

- Association meetings are important forums for information exchange between the executive and members - 2015 (85%) vs 2013 (77%)
- Association meetings are well run and worth

attending - 2015 (72%) vs 2013 (57%). Both senior and development squads rated this evenly

- The *Man in White* publication is enjoyable to read and worth continuing - 2015 (85%) vs 2013 (91%)

**People** - Ensuring that the people that form our membership are supported and valued in their past and present roles

- The payments (including travel and food allowances) I receive for umpiring are adequate - 2015 (83%) vs 2013 (69%)
- I find it beneficial for my development as an umpire to officiate alongside AFL umpires in the VFL competition - 2015 (92%) vs 2013 (82%)
- The VFUA's social program is well advertised - 2015 (76%) vs 2013 (84%)
- The VFUA should host a VFL Grand Final function - 2015 (86%) vs 2013 (80%)

The following activities / responsibilities are reasonably expected of me as a member of the VFUA:

- Attend all Association meetings - 2015 (81%) vs 2013 (66%).
- Attending Association Awards Night and AGM - 2015 (80%) vs 2013 (71%)

**Safety** - Ensuring that all procedures and provisions are in place to preserve the right and safety for members in their roles as Umpires

- I am aware of my responsibilities and expected behaviors as detailed in AFL Victoria's Bullying and Harassment policies - 2015 (91%) vs 2013 (85%)
- AFL Victoria adequately identifies and addresses bullying type behavior in the workplace - 2015 (67%) vs 2013 (56%)
- I would feel comfortable seeking the support of the VFUA if I observed or was subjected to bullying type behavior in the workplace - 2015 (90%) vs 2013 (83%)
- I am aware of AFL Victoria's Workcover policies if I were to sustain an umpire related injury - 2015 (86%) vs 2013 (76%). The senior squad - 89% led the development squad - 82%
- I am comfortable with accessing Workcover for any umpire related injury - 2015 (73%) vs 2013 (67%)
- I am comfortable reporting my injury to my Coach - 2015 (84%) vs 2013 (75%)

**Uniform/Training Gear**

- The uniform I receive for umpiring is adequate

for my needs - 2015 (86%) vs 2013 (99%), a significant drop. The senior squad rated 81% vs the development squad 92%. The percentage of disagree / strongly disagree increased from 0% to 10%

- The uniform I receive for training - 2015 (90%) vs 2013 (96%)
- The footwear I receive for umpiring is adequate for my needs - 2015 (82%) vs 2013 (96%), again a significant drop. Senior squad and development squad were 81% and 80% respectively.

The VFUA also uses result from the survey to provide feedback to AFL Victoria. The VFUA will also use the 2015 results to inform the fees and conditions working party, which will be established to put together our next employment agreement, given the current one expires at the end of 2016.
