PRESIDENT'S REPORT

Season 2021 was a rollercoaster year played out amid the COVID-19 pandemic.

From the start of the year, the association was in constant dialogue with the AFL about how our umpires could adapt to the circumstances as well as the announcement of the new VFL competition featuring teams from Brisbane and Sydney.

The VFUA successfully forged relationships with our umpiring association counterparts in Canberra, New South Wales and Queensland, negotiating employment conditions for VFL umpires in those states and territories.

With our newly appointed Members Representative, Peter Howe, leading the negotiations with the AFL, we secured the following conditions for our members:

- Same level of training retainer payments as prior years
- Introduction of a new travel payment for all umpires appointed to games in country Victoria in recognition of the time commitment for travel
- A new loss of entitlement allowance for umpires appointed to matches during normal business hours (Monday – Friday between 9am and 5pm)
- Every umpire received a part-time employment contract prior to the start of the new year

Nevertheless, there were some challenges:

- Senior match fees reduced (particularly for field umpires) in recognition of the broad impact of COVID-19 on the AFL industry
- Boundary umpires had their training retainer payments reduced as a result of a decision to train one night a week remotely rather than in-person at Victoria Park

Another major change was the distinction between senior and development squad umpire contracts.

Senior squad contracts ran until the end of August, whereas development squad contracts finished at the end of June in recognition of the timing of the NAB Girls and VELW seasons.

Thanks to transparent communication with the AFL, in particular Michael Jennings, Luke O'Brien, Chris Appleton and Amy Adams, these issues were dealt with smoothly.

We commend the AFL for their management of season 2021 and the many obstacles (border closures, umpire isolation, etc) that were navigated.

We set out at the start of the year to work with the AFL to do everything we could to finish the 2021 state league competitions.

This would provide our members with much-needed experience and opportunity after the break in 2020.

Whilst the season was ultimately cut short in July due to the COVID-19 pandemic, we should be proud of the fact that the NAB Girls season was successfully finalised and umpires were able to complete the majority of their season as well as a strong preseason.

I applaud our members for the flexibility shown throughout the season.

We umpired through multiple lockdowns, navigated our way through a mix of in-person and remote training and still managed to deliver an exceptional umpiring product.

The AFL did a fantastic job providing a COVID safe working environment for our umpires through check-ins, temperature measurements, face masks and separation of training squads.

If we managed all this in 2021, imagine what we are going to deliver in an uninterrupted 2022 season!

VFUA Members

I would like to congratulate 2020 VFUA members Nathan Toner (field), Kieran Ferguson (boundary) and Callum Leonard (goal) who were promoted to the AFL list in 2021.

This is a life-changing achievement and we wish each of them well for the rest of their careers. Victorian umpires dominated the 2021 AFLW season – 12 field umpires, 16 boundary umpires and 11 goal umpires.

After lowering our membership fees to \$100 last year in recognition of the COVID-19 pandemic, membership fees were reset to their 2019 levels of \$220 and we thank the 97% of Victorian umpires who joined as fully paid members.

Life Members

In between lockdowns, we were lucky to host our annual life member function in-person at Bells Hotel in June.

Congratulations to Kate Griffiths, our one new life member elected at the 2020 AGM for her excellent work delivering a strategic review of the VFUA. In addition, 2019 life members Simon Plumridge and Andrew Leggo were formally presented with their awards.

Peter Kelly was the recipient of a Lifetime Achievement Award for his extraordinary contribution and lifetime commitment to the umpiring profession and VFUA since its inception.

It was fantastic to bring together all the different generations of the VFUA on this night – everybody went home with their stomachs full and minds captivated by the many stories shared on the night.

VFUA Executive Team

It has been a pleasure to work with everyone this year on the VFUA executive.

Once again, it was a year of many video call meetings from home as we continued to soldier on through the many lockdowns.

We did manage, however, to have one in-person meeting at our annual planning day early in 2021 where I was struck by the infectious enthusiasm of our committee members who give up their time to get the best for state league umpires in Victoria.

Whilst I am often the "face" of the VFUA and it may seem like I am doing a lot of the work, the reality is starkly different.

Behind the scenes our track representatives and other executive members put in a mountain of work to deliver the final product that is seen via our email and Facebook communications.

Our track representatives this year were Peter Bailes, Dylan Fulton, Blake Anderson, Melissa Sambrooks and Luke Monea.

I would like to thank all of you for the tremendous amount of work that was put in to organise your squads and be the people on the ground that are arguably most important for the success of our association.

I commend you for putting up with my many group messages, as well as offering valuable insight and ideas from inside your squads.

The feedback from you enables the VFUA to take swift action during the year to quash problems that arise and deliver great outcomes for our members.

Thank you to my Vice-presidents Liam Pain and Joon-Yip Wong.

This year Liam has done an outstanding job organising new VFUA merchandise and our infamous cabinet which now sits at Victoria Park, taking a lead role in our first-year umpire induction and our second virtual Mini-Olympics.

Yip – you continue to deliver world-class content on our social media and website which has expanded the VFUA's reach on an astronomical scale.

David Flegg AM for providing sage advice on a range of strategic matters, as well as taking sole responsibility for our umpire statistics and Quality Assurance Program (QAP) which goes from strength to strength.

A thanks also to Matt Young, our events manager, who worked with Brad to deliver our life member dinner, as well as planning events such as our annual ball and grand final after party functions which were unable to proceed due to COVID-19 restrictions.

Our newly appointed Administrator, Brad Noonan.

Brad has continued to enhance our Google Drive documentation system, brought a fresh perspective to umpiring matters and successfully executed key events such as our life members dinner and first-year induction – thank you for all your hard work.

And last but not least, I think on behalf of all VFUA members, I would like to thank our Members' Representative, Peter Howe, for his unparalleled work managing communication with the AFL, resolving a significant number of confidential member issues and successfully negotiating our 2021 fees and conditions package.

I wish our members a restful 2021/2022 holiday period and look forward to seeing everyone back in action on the track for pre-season next year!

ADMINISTRATOR'S REPORT

While only the NAB Girls season was completed in 2021, it was great to have our members running around the ovals for most of the year.

But unfortunately, we continued to face the challenges of COVID-19 and I must commend everyone for the way you handled these both at training and games. It shows the professionalism and commitment of our group to the competitions we participate in.

Peter Kelly

I would like to acknowledge former VFUA Administrator and Life Member, Peter Kelly. With his well-earned retirement at the end of 2020, the association faced a big challenge of maintaining the high levels of organisation that had been a trademark of PK's reign.

The saying "you should try to leave a place in a stronger position than you found it" is very true for the VFUA as PK departed, everyone at the association owes him a great deal of thanks.

2021 Membership

With all the uncertainty faced at the start of the season, achieving 97% membership was a strong result. The support of our members is critical as our main duty is to represent the umpiring group to ensure our working conditions are satisfactory (if not higher).

We have a challenge to ensure that we can achieve 100% membership, but this cannot just be a goal in terms of a figure, we must ensure that EVERY running umpire believes their membership represents their interests.

VFUA Executive

There were times when we simply didn't know when the training session was going to be, let alone the next round of games, but the Executive Committee remained focussed on ensuring the members health and safety were maintained. To President Matt Mahoney, Vice-presidents Yip Wong and Liam Pain, Historian-Statistician David Flegg AM and Members' Representative Peter Howe, thank you for the way you have welcomed me into the association. You certainly represent the VFUA members extremely well. I also wish to recognise the significant work of the track reps. I've been extremely impressed with the way each of you work with the members, bringing information back to the Executive Committee. To Peter Bailes, Dylan Fulton, Blake Anderson, Melissa Sambrooks, Luke Monea and Events Manager Matt Young, your work is what keeps the association running so well and a huge thank you to each of you.

Umpire Performance

Congratulations to all the squads for their performances during the season. It certainly was a challenging season with the uncertainty of the fixtures and inability to train together. However, as mentioned previously, the continued professionalism of all umpires was testament to the resilience of the entire group. To the NAB Girls Grand Final Panel, who were the only ones able to officiate the big day in 2021, congratulations on your achievements. To the VFLW Grand Final Panel: Jackson Gillespie, Jordyn Pearson, Cameron Williams (F), Andrew Van Keulen, Benjamin Rofe, Mitchell O'Neill (B) Nelson Tucker and Pat Aurish (G) congratulations on your appointments. While the game wasn't played, be proud of your success.

AFLW Competition

The VFUA had a strong representation in the AFLW Umpire Panel, with 39% of the panel from Victoria. The AFLW competition continues to grow from strength to strength and will continue with the announcement of the league expansion in the 2022 and 2023 seasons. Congratulations to each member who was appointed to the AFLW Panel.

Awards

Given all the interruptions to the season, it is very pleasing to be able to present awards to deserving members. Congratulations to the Most Improved Umpires - Matthew Young (Field), Kyle Fisher (Boundary) and Matt Edwards (Goal) along with the Best First Year Umpires - Lachlan Coyne (Field), Riley Guerin (Boundary) and Emma Young (Goal).

To Riley Guerin, congratulations on being awarded the Frank Leverett Shield for the best overall first year umpire. This shows the impact you have had on the entire group not to mention your excellent on-field performances.

Milestones

A rare and special milestone was achieved by Andrew Talbot with 200 VFL games, which has only been achieved by three other umpires. "Turtle" has been an enormous contributor to the VFUA and deserves all the recognition he has received. Well done Turtle! Congratulations to all the other members who also achieved personal milestones during 2021, detailed later in this report.

Finances

The VFUA finished the year with a surplus of \$8,232.00, mainly due to the limited expenditure on functions and events due to the COVID-19 restrictions. The Executive Committee has agreed to allocate these monies to 2022 events.

Strategic Plan Review

This year saw the end of the 2018 – 2021 Strategic Plan, therefore it is timely to reflect on what the association has achieved since implementing the plan.

Leadership

"To have in place an Executive Committee capable of providing strong leadership of the association."

The leadership of the association has been extremely stable during the time of the Strategic Plan, particularly through our presidents. The Strategic Plan was implemented in the final period of Michael Curtis' presidency, followed by Andrew Talbot and our current President Matthew Mahoney. These three individuals have been at the forefront of the association's work, along with all the dedicated of office bearers and track representatives who have been behind the scenes.

Membership

"To consistently strive for 100% membership of all listed umpires by being credible, relevant and respected."

During the period of the Strategic Plan, it has been pleasing to see the membership rate rise towards the 100% target. In that there was 2018 95% membership, 2019 94%, 2020 99% (even with no season due to COVID-19) and 2021 97%. The association has always aimed to find out why running umpires haven't joined the association and regularly it has been due to personal reasons rather than lack of performance by the association. As we begin planning for the next Strategic Plan, it is critical that we ensure we communicate with all umpires the value of being a VFUA member and the benefits they will receive.

Advocacy & Representation

"To advocate for and represent members in industrial and workplace issues in a professional and timely manner."

Through the creation of the VFUA Member Representative position, the association has strengthened the way it represents members' in the areas of workplace conditions and renumeration. The appointment of Peter Howe has been critical due to his experience within the AFLUA and AFL Operations, but also his ability to create trust with individual members. While specifics always remain confidential, it has been wonderful to see individual umpires communicate with Peter about their concerns and issues. Peter also has been crucial in the association's increased communication with the AFL / VFL.

Another vital aspect of the VFUA has been the role of track representatives, who are a driving force behind the dealings with members. It cannot be understated the importance of these roles for the association.

Relationships

"To maintain and foster a healthy working relationship with AFL Victoria (now AFL), AFLUA and other kindred associations."

It is pleasing to report that the communication between the association and the league administration has improved year by year. This has been through the hard work of the VFUA Members' Representative, Peter Howe and we also acknowledge the work of league staff Grant Williams, Luke O'Brien, Michael Jennings, Chris Appleton, Amy Adams and Cameron Nash.

Fees & Conditions

"To ensure our agreement is legally compliant, differentiates between each umpiring discipline and level of football competition, ensures that payments appropriately recognise the different skill levels and commitment required and is flexible to provide avenues for AFL Victoria to meet their objectives for the development and progression of umpires."

After several years working towards achieving improved fees and conditions for members, the association signed a new agreement with the AFL in 2020. This covered umpires being categorised as part-time employees of the AFL, new training payments and back payments for members where the payments received failed to meet the minimum payments by law.

Social

"To organise and deliver social events that are valued and well attended by our members."

One of the strongest aspects of the association continues to be providing social events for the members, past and present. From current member events including annual events including the Mini Olympics (a fundraiser for the Cancer Council in memory of Paul Anderson), Grand Final After Function, and End of Year Ball.

Regular squad events are also held during the season, along with the annual Life Members Function and President's Dinner. The global pandemic certainly put a pause on these events during 2020 and 2021, however, providing social opportunities will continue to be a priority for the VFUA.

Welfare

"To explore opportunities to partner with AFL Victoria on a range of wellbeing programs and services for our members."

Over the past four years, the welfare of members has become an increasing focus for the association. This was especially the case in 2020 due to the cancellation of all football competitions due to Covid-19, and again with the numerous interruptions and uncertainty experienced in 2021. The association was able to establish a support program with the AFL using the services of AFL Psychologist, Greg Buck. Several online sessions were held for all members through this period, with Greg also available to individuals on a confidential and free basis. The welfare of individuals has become a major part of everyday society and particularly for sporting officials who face challenges on and off the field each week.

Each year the association has worked with the AFL / VFL administration on the Quality Assurance Program (QAP), providing invaluable feedback to the League relating to the conditions at grounds (relating to both umpires and grounds/facilities). Issues raised by members include; umpire security during games, changeroom facilities, venue standards, and provisions supplied by the home club. While at times it is frustrating to see certain matters regularly needing attention, it is also fair to say that the League and clubs generally address issues raised promptly.

Communication

"To ensure communication between members, the Executive Committee, AFL Victoria / AFL and any other relevant organisations occurs in a timely manner using appropriate methods."

Life Members

"To maintain and develop a link with and recognise the important contribution made by life members."

Maintaining links with our life members is an important role for the association, not only to keep links to our past, but to inspire and motivate our current and future. During the period of this Strategic Plan, the annual Life Members Function has continued to be the main way in which we connect with our Life Members. We have also introduced 11 new Life Members to this honoured club. Further details of the most recent inductee, Kate Griffiths are included later in this report.

Recognition

"To recognise the achievements of the association and its members."

One of the most significant initiatives of the association is the maintenance of its historical records, in terms of the association and individual members. Through the tireless work by Executive member and Life Member, David Flegg, the ability to recognise the individual milestones and achievements by members continues to be a key feature of the association.

Finances

"To manage finances of the VFUA in a responsible manner that maximises benefits to members."

The financial management of the association continues to operate using a breakeven budget and maintains a stable amount of assets. Being able to conduct operations while maintaining our level of assets proves the successful management of the association finances.

In closing, I think every member can reflect on the challenges faced over the last two seasons and be proud of the way you as individuals have handled the difficulties. It's by facing challenges and coming through them that we grow, and I look forward to being able to work with you in what is hopefully a 'normal' 2022.

2020 LIFE MEMBER KATE GRIFFITHS

In the late 1990s the VFUA changed the life membership qualification inherited from the AFLUA, removing automatic life membership.

The idea was to focus on service to the association rather than umpiring longevity.

Kate Griffiths is an outstanding example of impact over time involved

Kate arrived in Victoria from Canberra in 2014 by way of the United Kingdom where she completed her university studies and began VFUA service by taking on the role of track representative (goal) in 2016, immediately followed by the more recently created communications role in 2017.

In addition to her executive duties, Kate undertook a comprehensive review of the operations of the VFUA to assist the association in setting a completely revamped strategic direction.

In undertaking this review, Kate consulted widely with key stakeholders including VFL personnel, VFUA members and life members.

Her final detailed report included many significant recommendations to the structure of the association which the VFUA Executive Committee endorsed and implemented immediately.

They are part of the strategic and operational systems in place today and include the most recently added role of VFUA members' representative that has been successful in recent fees and conditions negotiations.

She was best first year goal umpire in 2014.





ANDREW TALBOT 200TH MATCH

Ahead of the incredible achievement of reaching the 200 VFL game, a milestone achieved by only three umpires before him, Peter Bailes had the pleasure of sitting down with someone he has looked up to on his journey and who has set a benchmark for the commitment and passion required for umpiring state league football. Andrew 'Turtle' Talbot discusses all things life, as well as the continued dedication and passion he has for umpiring and football.

Peter Bailes: So, let's start on the fact that you've reached 200 games, congratulations on the achievement first and foremost. Two-part question. First, what's been the best achievement, and what have been some of the greatest times for you along the journey?

Andrew Talbot: Achievement wise, the individual pursuit of getting appointed to games like my state league game, the 2018 grand final. Even as umpiring has now become a team effort, it's still nice to enjoy the individual accolades along the way.

Personally, though the best highlights have not necessarily been around being appointed to these matches, it's the moments such as umpiring with Dos in his last game, umpiring with Burgo in his life membership game, in which he decided to stay in the EZ all day mind you. And of course, the off-field shenanigans, Mad Mondays and catch ups with the extended group.

PB: Tell me about the time you were meant to run a marathon on the Sunday of a planned weekend away with the boys? Talk to me about your preparation for the event?

This was one of the better weekends I've ever had. So, I was meant to run the marathon on the Sunday, and I was 'adequately hydrating' myself on the Friday night, and I may have had one too many beers, and I wasn't in a good way come early Saturday morning.

Then I spent the Saturday by the pool and properly rehydrating myself, ate my pasta and drank a Lucozade on the Saturday night, and then I was good to go come Sunday. Elite preparation."

PB: Where did the turtle tattoo originate?

AT: "The tattoo represents a symbol from Vanuatu, representing perseverance, longevity and protection."

PB: Most embarrassing moment umpiring?

AT: "I didn't rock up for a scheduled game once, there was one email saying that the venue was changed. Somewhere along the line I missed the 2nd email with a day change and didn't rock up on the Saturday, unfortunately left Cheever and Annie to do a reserves game by themselves. After five senior games, Ian Brown told me that I should be umpiring Under 12's footy'. I think I have come a long way since then.

Or how about how Phil Cleary said during one of my early TV games that 'Andrew Talbot is a very technical umpire'. I haven't changed since then.

PB: We won't talk about that GF bounce, I'm sure you're reminded of that regularly."

PB: What does the future hold for the great man? VFL games record, another grand final?

AT: I just want to umpire as long as I can, I'd love to help to continue to develop the umpires that are coming through. It's great to be able to contribute to the group and seeing all of the umpires progress through the ranks and watching them improve.

PB: On the topic of umpires coming through the ranks, what's the best advice for the up-and-coming umpires of the VFL, as well as all the local community umpires you work with?

AT: The biggest thing that I've learnt is that you need to have a release outside of umpiring. I've seen too many umpires come down to the VFL and be too focused on making it as an umpire and it doesn't work out, or they umpire poorly, and it affects them. And I know that's contradictory of my job, as I basically eat Acme Thunderers, but when I'm not working or umpiring, I'm doing triathlons, exploring Australia or the world or watching any sport. I think it's important to find what release works best for you, and don't be afraid to give things a try."



MATT EDWARDS 100TH MATCH

On Saturday evening the 1st of May at the Downer Oval, Matt Edwards became the 78th umpire in the VFUA era to reach the 100-game milestone when he officiated in the Williamstown-Port Melbourne grudge match.

He also became the 20th goal umpire and the second from the Diamond Valley/Northern Football league to reach the milestone.

Matt joined the VFL in 2012 and later went on to make his debut in senior footy in 2014 when Coburg played Werribee at Piranha Park. Matt comes from an umpiring family with his father being a 300 game legend of the Diamond Valley Football League, and his brother Jack also completing 100 VFL matches on either side of a stint at the AFL.

Matt credits both his father and brother's involvement in the game as a catalyst for getting him involved, and also notes the first senior game that he did with Jack at the VFL as being one of the favourite moments of his career.



The career has included the 2016 TAC Cup and 2017 VFL Development League Grand Finals and being involved in AFLW the past two seasons.

The latter culminated in being the emergency for this year's decider between Adelaide and Brisbane and indicates a career thus far of consistency and solid performances week to week.

When pressed for his favourite moment he said that there were too many to mention, but did point out his involvement in the numerous grand finals as being a highlight, and also being able to share his 100th game with his family in the rooms post-match.

When asked if he has a favourite ground he was adamant that ETU Stadium would be his favourite by the length of the Flemington straight. Contrary to this he would have to say that the Downer Oval would have to be his least favourite and one that he had managed to avoid for two years.

This statement confused the author of this article especially considering that his requested game happened to be a night game at Williamstown and the last time Matt had done a night game at Williamstown game there was a torrential downpour.

Thankfully for Matt and the author Williamstown managed to produce one of its more pleasant evenings.

Congratulations again Matt on the achievement of 100 VFL senior games!!!

CYRUS WONG RETIRES

Resilience, determination and persistence are just some of the many values that embody 2021 VFL senior goal umpire retiree, Cyrus Wong. Cyrus' 136 VFL Senior Games is an incredible effort spanning over a decade career at the VFL between the posts.

Failing the time trial in 2014 led to Cyrus embarking on a unique and physically demanding journey, to run every current and defunct Melbourne train, tram and bus route.

This journey for Cyrus later led to him beating the time trial requirements and running those thousands of kilometres demonstrated his determination to overcome his previous challenges both physically and mentally.

Running alongside Cyrus and former VFL goal umpire, Pete Balding in his final section of the public transport network was a memory to hold for many years to come. Noted James Rizio, "To see Cyrus' face and reaction at the end of this journey was priceless."

James also had the pleasure of umpiring with Cyrus in his final VFL match, held at what would be his home away from home, Whitten Oval.



Cyrus remained professional and competent all the way to the final siren, it was a humbling experience to be there in person and I was extremely honoured to have had Cyrus choose me for his final game," said Rizio.

And at that final siren Cyrus had accumulated 136 VFL, 59 VFL Reserves, 41 NAB Boys and 2 VFLW matches. VFL finals in 2012, 2013 and 2017 indicate Cyrus's ability at the state level.

The 2012 NAB Boys Grand Final and Most Improved Goal Umpire Award capped his most successful on-field year. It could have all ended at the completion of the 2018 season when Cyrus was de-listed.

However, his sense of justice and determination drove him to appeal the decision and was justified with reinstatement and a continuation at VFL level in 2019.

Andrew Talbot who was one of the field umpires at Box Hill in Cyrus's first VFL match in 2010, his 100th at Sandringham in 2017 and was also present at his last summed up many others thoughts. "From his first game, through to his last, Cyrus has my utmost respect after having to deal with multiple adversities to be able to finish his career on his own terms.

Running time trials always brought on anxiety, but to fail one and turn it into a strength is a testament to his resilience and determination.

I had the privilege of being part of three milestones, as well as many others in between at state league level. He is definitely one umpire who I will have plenty of time for in the many years to come post both of our careers!

All the best for retirement Cyrus and for your future endeavours away from the VFL world.

PETER KELLY RETIRES

The words on the Lifetime Achievement Award presented to Peter Kelly at the 2021 VFUA Life Members Dinner capture the essence of his vast contribution:

A man whose passion for umpiring has changed the game. This award celebrates his extraordinary contribution and lifetime commitment to the umpiring profession and the association since its inception.

But what of the detail; and details were always part of the way PK conducted business - endless details.

The VFUA was formed in 1992 and began work for the 1993 season as the Victorian State Football League Umpires' Association - Social Secretary, Peter Kelly.

In the following years, PK and his committees organised 5-6 events per year from the UPD to variety nights to the grand final dinner dances. These events were also run for the AFLUA and catered for upwards of 350 attendees at the ball.

Taking on the role of both treasurer and social secretary in 1994 he was instrumental in the change of structure of the association from 1995 when he became VFUA administrator and later executive officer.

As 1996 President Greg Kennedy noted "My greatest recollection of PK during my time as president, was I never once had to worry about anything administrative.

The VFUA was only a few years old and it was new ground we were breaking. Peter was instrumental in the formation of this great group".

As administrator much fell into PK's purview. Dealing with the VFL administration, usually in the form of Kevin Mitchell could be challenging but PK developed a process to deal with Mitch, his reactions and the sometimes concerning liberties or directions the VFL wanted to take with its umpires.

It was an indication of 2006-07 President, Rob Findlay's thoughts that "PKs greatest asset is his ability to develop fantastic relationships with people across a broad spectrum.

PK's experience in human resources certainly put him in the box seat for drafting policies and initiatives in advance of the VFL: heat policy, formalised selection policies, extensive contributions to fees and condition arrangements, the biennial VFUA survey and he was also never far away from social events as either having some part in planning or as an enthusiastic participant.

And it was not just the VFUA as an organisation that benefitted from his involvement.

Two former presidents both reflected what the association and individuals received, I loved working with PK and learnt a lot. There was never anything left to chance.

He thought of everything and he is the single reason why our association is in such good order today.

Presidents and Executive members come and go.

This can have a topsy turvy effect on any association. However, PK has been the rock. The strategy has never diverted and each year the conditions for umpires in the VFL get better and better.

Umpires are respected more and the powers that be at Football Victoria have a greater understanding of who we are and what we want to achieve. Why – because one man has had a single vision.

That vision has been to ensure that every umpire has the best possible chance to succeed and that they are well looked after by a professional organisation whilst they are a member (Russell Davidson, 1999)

If PK had not taken the VFUA by the reins who knows where it may have ended up. His passion, dedication and certainly commitment to his roles, the Executive Officer position, show what type of person PK is.

He has assisted a lot of people, including myself with their leadership skills and developed some fantastic role models for up and coming umpires. He has done all this whilst most importantly having fun (Adam Wojcik, 2007)

VFUA matters were never far from his mind regardless of location. Richard Mills recruitment as president was one example.

"In my time on the list PK was always present at functions (drink in hand!) mixing with and welcoming everyone that came along. I used to run into PK at any one of the many MCC bar's on grand final day each year and we would have a chat.

One year the conversation turned into an invitation to run for presidency of the association - an invitation I took up. Without having been on the executive before - it was always going to be a big challenge. PK was there right the way though, always a constant support."

And let us not forget that PK was also a 36-match AFL goal umpire in the early days of the then VSFLUA and had contributed to the AFLUA on the Social Committee in 1989 and as Social Secretary in 1992 before that role was merged with the VSFLUA.

He was also Penguin Vic while working at the Department of Tourism, being aptly cast through both stature and likeability.

Currently working in a part-time role with the AFLUA it's a pretty full working life following his retirement from the Victorian public service - although they will be noting a large drop in the photocopying and printing costs in the last few years.

Peter Kelly leaves VFUA office after 29 of outstanding service having taken the association from infancy to maturity such that it was recognised as the bargaining agent for the new VFL competition incorporating umpires from NSW and Queensland.

He remains as life member, Special Award and Lifetime Achievement Award recipient and respected among the association Executive Committees with which he has worked and by the generations of umpires he has served.

A man whose passion for umpiring has changed the game.

KEVIN MITCHELL OAM

Former VFL Director of Umpiring and VFUA Life Member Kevin Mitchell was the recipient of a Medal of the Order of Australia (OAM) in the 2021 Queens Birthday Honours.

Over his 24 years in charge of umpiring in the VFL Mitch, as he was universally known, transformed it on more than one occasion and introduced much of what is taken for granted today.

Over the course of his umpiring administrative and coaching career he has influenced hundreds of umpires many of whom have had significant AFL and VFL careers.

Speaking with the AFL in 2014 following his retirement he noted ""if you stand still and stop looking for improvement you will fall away quickly. I was always challenged by the drive to get better."

The physical legacy of the Victoria Park training facility which he worked so hard to have built is perhaps the most obvious result of Mitch's persistence in so many things in life.

Negotiating with Collingwood, Yarra Council, builders and the VFL administration he took a decrepit building and made a home for Victorian umpiring.

The provision of match day trainers, the regular upgrading of coaching technical equipment to improve performance, the employment on non-umpiring professionals such as dieticians and psychologists were other initiatives that have become the regular part of the modern umpire's experience at VFL level.

It is that VFL level that has provided the vast majority of AFL field, boundary and goal umpires in the last quarter of a century. Those that have made it to that level recognise Mitch's influence.

It was rarely smooth sailing for anyone but the striving for perfection and the honesty of the feedback built formidable umpires.

Mitch's contribution to Victorian state level umpiring was recognised by the association with life membership of the VFUA in 2006.

Like his coaching the relationship between the Umpiring Department and the association was rocky at times but both recognised they were looking to get the best for the umpires and that was what was important. Harmony was rarely far away.

Mitch's umpiring credentials were second to none.

He began as a boundary umpire in the VFL Reserve Grade in 1962 and was promoted to the VFL following his appointment to the 1967 VFL Reserve Grade Grand Final.

The immediacy of his success was remarkable; a final in his first year and then four consecutive VFL grand finals. When he retired from the VFL his career stood at 236 matches including 23 finals and 8 VFL grand finals.

Off the field he contributed to the VFL Umpires' Association in a significant manner.

As trip organiser 1971-76 and Executive Committee member 1971-74 he remains the only boundary umpire to ever ascend to the presidency of the association in 1977.

His association honours include life membership, Lifetime Achievement Award, AFLUA Team of the Century and AFLUA Hall of Fame induction.

Prior to his role at the VFL he held various umpiring administration roles:

Umpires Advisor Dandenong and District JFL 1980-83,
Umpires Advisor Southern Umpires 1984,
Assistant Director of Umpiring VFA 1985,
Part-time Umpire Recruitment and Promotions Officer VFL 1986-88,
Full time Umpire Recruitment and Promotions Officer VFL 1989-90.
He was recognised in 2000 with an Australian Sport Medal.

Congratulations Mitch on your honour it is well-deserved recognition for a life of service to umpiring Australian football at every level.


